COOPERATIVES MOST SUITED FOR LOCAL DEVELOPMENT

- □ COOPERATIVES SINCE RESPECT THE LOCAL CULTURE & VALUES AND UNDERSTAND LOCAL WAY OF LIVING, ARE THUS IN AN ADVANTAGEOUS POSITION TO UNDERSTAND THE LOCAL NEEDS. THEREFORE, CAN HAVE A FOCUSSED APPROACH ON LOCAL DEVELOPMENT.
- □ COOPERATIVE ENTERPRISES ORGANIZE THE LOCAL PEOPLE AND IMPROVE THEIR SKILLS TO OPTIMISE THE LOCAL RESOURCES. THUS COOPERATIVES ARE THE MAIN TOOL FOR THE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT.
- □ COOPERATIVES INVOLVE AND ENTHUSE EVERY SECTION OF THE SOCIETY IRRESPECTIVE OF CASTE, CREED AND RELIGION AND ENSURES THEIR ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN LOCAL DEVELOPMENT.

CONTINUED....

□ COOPERATIVES PROVIDE PLATFORM FOR INTERACTION AMONG THE MEMBERS THAT BUILDS TRUST WHICH HELPS IN PLANNING LOCAL DEVELOPMENT EFFICIENTLY AND ALSO FOSTERS SOCIAL COHESION.

- □ COOPERATIVES SETTLE CONFLICTS FOR THE RESOURCES WITHIN AND BETWEEN COMMUNITIES AND CAN ALSO RESOLVE CONFLICTS WITH OUTSIDE FORCES THAT THREATEN TO EXPLOIT LOCAL ECOSYSTEMS AND UNDERMINE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT.
- □ COOPERATIVES HAVING CONCERN FOR COMMUNITY, HAVE CONCERNS FOR THE NATURAL RESOURCES OF THAT AREA, DO NOT OVER-EXPLOIT THUS MAINTAIN LOCAL ECO-SYSTEM.

CONTINUED....

- □ COOPERATIVES SINCE WORK IN CLOSE COORDINATION WITH ITS MEMBERS CAN ACT AS BEST INSTRUMENT FOR KNOWLEDGE MULTIPLICATION. THUS, THEY CAN BETTER PREPARE THEIR MEMBERS. ESPECIALLY FOR
 - Nursing and First Aid
 - Natural disaster
 - Climate change
 - Global warming

□ COOPERATIVES IDENTIFY THE NEW OPPORTUNITIES AND TECHNOLOGY AND REALIGN IT LOCALLY THAT ULTIMATELY LEADS TO LOCAL DEVELOPMENT.

□ COOPERATIVES ARE BASED ON THE PRINCIPLE OF COOPERATION AND CAN COORDINATE WITH COOPERATIVES/OTHER AGENCIES IN THE SAME AREA TO FACILITATE THE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT.

- COOPERATIVE GENERATE LOCAL EMPLOYMENT
 MAINTAIN THE BALANCE IN RURAL AND URBAN HABITAT
 & CONTROL THE FALLOUTS OF EXODUS FROM VILLAGES
 TO CITIES.
- □ COOPERATIVE CAN MAKE VALUE ADDITION TO THE LOCAL PRODUCTS/SERVICES THAT IMPROVES THE QUALITY & LIFE OF THE PRODUCT AND PROVIDES BETTER RETURN TO THE LOCAL PRODUCER.
- □ COOPERATIVES CAN ENCOURAGE THE SCALING UP OF LOCAL SUCCESSES AND CAN CONNECT LOCAL EFFORTS TO NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL LEVEL MAKING THE LOCAL EFFORTS GLOCAL.

WEAKNESS OF COOPERATIVES IN FACILITATING LOCAL DEVELOPMENT

□ POLITICAL INTERFERENCE, THE GOVERNMENT USING COOPERATIVES AS ITS OWN ARM.

LACK OF ACTIVE LEADERSHIP AND PROFESSIONAL MANAGEMENT.

LACK OF MEMBER PARTICIPATION

COOPERATIVE MODEL OF BUSINESS DOES NOT HAVE A RECOGNISED SINGLE GLOBAL BRAND.

□ LACK OF FUNDS

□ HAVE TO COMPETE WITH CORPORATES (ECONOMY OF SCALE)

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

- Forming Cooperative Societies made Fundamental Right
- Right of a Member for Access to Information
- Regular and Timely Conduct of General Body Meetings;
- Reservation of Seats for Women and Underprivileged Caste in Board
- Timely Conduct of Elections

□ NATIONAL POLICY ON COOPERATIVES (2002)

- Minimizing Role of Government in Management of Cooperatives
- Encouragement to work as an autonomous, self-reliant and democratically managed institutions

ROLE OF INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION

- □ INTERNATIONAL COOPERATIVE ALLIANCE (ICA)
 - PROVIDING INTERNATIONAL PLATFORM FOR COOPERATION
 - LOBBY GOVERNMENTS AND PROMOTES POLICY ENVIRONMENT CONDUCIVE TO COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT.
 - BUILDING TRADE RELATIONS AMONG COOPERATIVES
 - ADVOCATES THE INTERESTS AND SUCCESS OF CO-OPERATIVES
 - CONSOLIDATE AND BUILD STRATEGIC ALLIANCES/NETWORKS
 - CAPACITY BUILDING THROUGH EDUCATION & TRAINING
- INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS LIKE UNO, FAO AND ILO WORKING TOWARDS CREATING OPPORTUNITIES FOR EMPLOYMENT GENERATION, SKILL DEVELOPMENT, FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION ACTIVITIES.
- ACDI/VOCA, USA IS WORKING TOWARDS PROVIDING BETTER MARKET ACCESS TO THE FARMERS THROUGH INFORMATION COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY.

ROLE OF COOPERATIVES

- □ INDIAN COOPERATIVE MOVEMENT IS ONE OF THE LARGEST COOPERATIVE MOVEMENTS IN THE WORLD WITH ABOUT 0.6 MILLION COOPERATIVE SOCIETIES INVOLVING 249 MILLION MEMBERS AND COVERING ALMOST 100% OF THE VILLAGES.
- □ COOPERATIVES IN INDIA PROMOTES INCLUSIVE GROWTH AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.
- □ COOPERATIVES IN INDIA ARE WORKING IN ALMOST EVERY FIELD OF BUSINESS, PARTICULARLY RELATED TO AGRICULTURE.
- HAVE DIVERSIFIED IN DIFFERENT SECTORS ACCORDING TO THE EMERGING ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES AND NEEDS OF ITS MEMBERS.

- PRIMARILY ENGAGED IN PRODUCTION AND MARKETING OF FERTILISERS.
- LARGEST PRODUCER & MARKETEER OF FERTILISERS IN INDIA, WITH ABOUT 40,000 MEMBER SOCIETIES & OVER 55 MILLION FARMERS ASSOCIATED WITH THEM.
