
About 4.9 million young people were living with HIV in developing countries in 2008: 3.23 million young women and 1.64 million young men

Global Burden and Regional Context

- Out of 4.9 million young people living with HIV, 80% are in sub-Saharan Africa, 60% of them (2.9 million) are in eastern and southern Africa.
- Fifty-five per cent of all young people living with HIV are female. In sub-Saharan Africa and in eastern and southern Africa specifically,
 70% of young people living with HIV are female.
- An estimated 60% of all young women living with HIV globally (2 million out of 3.23 million) are in eastern and southern Africa.
- South Africa, Kenya, Mozambique and Zambia are among the 10 countries with the largest number of young people living with HIV.

In 9 countries, all in southern Africa, at least one in 20 young people is living with HIV. In Botswana, Lesotho and Swaziland, more than 1 in 10 young people live with HIV.

In contrast, in the next 10 countries with the highest prevalence in young people, between 2 to 3 out of every 100 young people is living with HIV.
