Guiding Questions for the focus areas of the tenth Session of the Open-ended Working Group on Ageing: Education, training, life-long learning and capacity-building.

National Legal Framework:

1- It is guaranteed through illiteracy Act No.23 in 2011 and the instructions related to implementing illiteracy Act no.1 on 30 April 2012.

Availability, Accessibility and Adaptability:

- 2- Lack of enough time for learning due to their several activities.
- 3- Programs encouraging life-long learning launched by the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific research.
- 4-

Equality and Non-discrimination:

5- There is a quality and non-discrimination according to illiteracy law no.23 in 2011, in relation to education in older age.

Accountability:

6- The mechanisms through the Directorate of Special Needs, Iraqi High Commission for Human rights, Inspector General Office, Ministerial Follow-up Committees, reporting directly to the respective Directorate, and other mechanisms.

Guiding Questions: Social Protection and Social Security.

National Legal Framework:

- 1- A- Retirement and Social Security Workers Act no.39 in 1971 with amendments.
 - B- Social Protection Act no.11 in 2014.
 - C- Commission of Persons with Disabilities and Special Needs Act no.38 in 2013.
 - D- Nursing Home scheme no.4 in 1985.

Availability:

2-3 Everybody receives pension at the end of his services at the age of 60 (men) and 55 (women) with 20-year service according to Article (65) of Retirement and Social Security Act.

Adequacy:

4- Social Security salary is granted to everybody unable to work permanently and elderly people in the 60 years-old (men) and 55 years-old women. Also, free Nursing Homes are available to those excluded from their families with monthly pocket money, food, psycho and social services, Health insurance and recreational services.

Accessibility:

- 5-6 A- Through demographic trend.
 - B- Poverty data available at the Social Research Office.
- C- An application prepared by the Commission of Social Protection in collaboration with the Ministry of Planning.

Equality and non-discrimination:

- 7- A- In accordance with Social Security Act, elderly persons are covered according to age, taking into consideration the services of the secured workers.
 - B- Inspection visits made by the Inspection Dept. in the Directorate of Employment and Loans.
 - C- Field visits to the families by mobile teams.

Accountability:

- 8- A- Mechanisms of social security: through Inspection Teams of Inspection Dept. in the Directorate of Employment and Loans.
 - B- Mechanisms of Social Protection: through IT Center since its data have been linked with the data base of Central Statistics Organization and other respective organs, according to Article 20, Law no.11 in 2014.
- 9- A- Judicial mechanisms: Filing a complaint in the Labor Court against employer.
 - B- non-judicial mechanisms: Exemption from fines due to payment delay of contributions if the employer was exposed to unforeseen circumstances because of security and other reasons.
