Q2 The purpose of the organization:

To secure the rights and care of prisoners aging and dying in prisons.

Q3 Information as to the programmes and activities of the organization in areas relevant to the human rights of older persons:

Advocating for the rights of the aging in prison to have dignity and humane end of life care.

Using data from the United States Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS), Human Rights Watch calculates that the number of sentenced federal and state prisoners who are age 65 or older grew an astonishing 94 times faster than the total sentenced prisoner population between 2007 and 2010. The older prison population increased by 63 percent, while the total prison population grew by 0.7 percent during the same period. (The Nation)
